Circular economy to stimulate economic growth: separation of recovered waste, bazaars for employees, and green donations, among others.



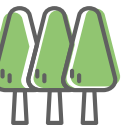
We provide spaces for **the sale of local handicrafts** from 12 Mayan communities.



We make **purchases of environmentally friendly products**, with products that have a complete life cycle, are from the local area, and are sustainable.



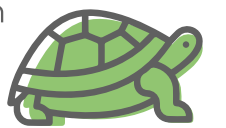
Implementation of the **use of ozone** to reduce the use of chlorine, water, and energy.
